Home protection

As the thermometer rises, snowbirds fly across the weather fence to greener grass and cooler pastures. Your SpringPointe home is now vacant and needs protection.

Suggestions for protecting your property have been listed, over the past years, in the Green Valley News, by SAV, and other organizations. SpringPointe has added a few also. Having a friend or good neighbor conduct a regular check on your home is seen by most people as the best solution. You can also ask the Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteers to "Keep an eye" on your property.

Here are a few suggestions for the outside:

1. Make sure the drip system is in good shape
2. Leave your yard well groomed and have someone maintain it while you are gone
3. Turnover empty pots without drain holes. (This will keep water from collecting during the monsoon season and will help control the mosquitos).
4. Cancel newspaper delivery

Before you leave:

1. Close and cover all drains
2. Cover toilet bowls with plastic wrap
3. Turn power off to the water heater
4. Turn off all ceiling fans and lights
5. Lock all windows and close blinds
6. Unplug all electrical appliances
7. Clean refrigerator and keep door open
8. Turn water off to the icemaker
9. Turn water to washing machine off
10. Set air conditioner at 85 degrees
11. Lock all doors

New Exterior House Colors

The architectural committee received a request to consider adding some new paint colors. The group who asked provided several suggestions for colors compatible with the existing paint colors. The committee evaluated the suggestions and eliminated several color combinations as being too similar to the current colors or too busy in keeping with the refined look of not only SpringPointe, but all the subdivisions in Green Valley. Trendy colors come and then go just as fast, so the committee felt that trendy colors belong in the privacy of SpringPointe's homes. As we are a large subdivision with varied color sense among the residents, we try to represent the HOA instead of special interest groups.

The committee had observed that one of the previous body colors, Pebblestone, has not stood the impact of the hot Southwest sun. It fades to a different color and is not attractive after only a short time. That color was kept as a trim color but removed from the body colors. Those homeowners who have Pebblestone for a body color are asked to choose another color when they repaint.

The committee chose three green colors from the committee's suggestions reflecting the cacti, agave and native tree colors here as well as one new body color compatible with most trim sets. We hope everyone enjoys the new look when the colors start to appear!
