Most of us have our scam and fraud stories to tell. We are wiser and older now but scammers are more sophisticated and convincing today.

Green Valley has a special SCAM Squad which is part of the Sheriff's Auxiliary Volunteers. Aren't we lucky to have this protective and informative volunteer group on location to help prevent us from being victims of conniving shysters? And yet, the blindfold of trust can still make us losers in a conman's game.

Some of the many scams in Green Valley are:

If you have been a victim of any scam you need to report it to the Scam Squad. This action will alert the squad to new scams and may keep another person from becoming a victim. Ask for assistance and help in identifying scams and get advice if you have questions about a possible scam.

We need to take heed of the following scam information in this quoted paragraph. "Keep your money and information private. Protect financial information, S.S. numbers, and insurance information. Do not use passwords, credit card number or bank account on Public Wi –Fi. Stop. Check it out. Take your time! Help prevent crime by Hang up, Shred, Delete."
