How green is my valley? Greener than I have ever seen it. Flora sprung up overnight. Some weeds grew as high as your head. Even the mine tailings supported a growth that tinted them light green. Spring showers bring the flowers that bloom in March but July brought more flowers than spring.

KOLD reported the 2021 monsoon season from June 15—Sept 30 was the third wettest on record. Over a foot, 12.79 inches, of water soaked the desert floor. But give the first place trophy to July for breaking the record for the wettest July by dumping 8 inches of water.

The rain was welcomed after an extremely hot June. But soon problems developed from ground saturation and flooding became an issue. Many worry about a fire hazard when plant growth dies and becomes dry.



#### **Green Valley/Green Thumbs**

In 2014, the Green Valley Gardeners took over Desert Meadow Park, the 4.2–acre park property at 999 South La Huerta, Green Valley, to be used as a botanical garden for the enjoyment of all in the community. This project is financially supported by Green Valley Gardeners' fund raisers, grants, and community donations.

Desert Meadows Park provides botanical pleasures for all who come and roam around the park. The Park also offers on going stewardship to anyone interested. There is much to be done in the park and many opportunities for volunteers.

The nursery has a wide assortment of plants, pots, and gardenalia. Everything you see for sale has been nurtured with expert care and green thumbs. In the community gardens there are 65 garden plots available to Garden Club members to rent. When the plot owner is gone, the garden staff takes over their plot and the food grown goes to the Sahuarita Food Bank. There are also multiple designated food bank beds



that provide fresh organic vegetables all year round. Our average yearly total to the food bank is 3500 pounds. Our seven-year total is over 20,000 pounds!

Several SpringPointe owners are Garden Club members. Interested in joining or just learning more? Come on over to Desert Meadows and take a walk around the park, enjoy nature at Her best. If you see an area you'd like to volunteer in or something specific you'd like to do, we'd love to have you!
